#### **DIVISION AND NATIONAL REPORTS**

##### **Far West Division Director, Lance Vaughan**

Reminder that all members under the age of 18 need to be registered as YAP's.

Division will coordinate the certification of members' completion of ICS 100.

This year's election of members to the National Board is ongoing with just one

Candidate from west of the Mississippi River.

Registration for Powderfall, next April, is filling up. Interested people should register now.

Registration process has changed. On Dec. 1 each patrol will receive a notice of their Division dues which should be paid prior to Dec. 31 to avoid a late fee.

The Safe Sports Act requires mandatory reporting of any suspected child abuse or neglect. It is recommended that patrollers not be alone with minor patients.

There is a new beta version training program for new patrol representatives.

##### **Far West Division Awards Supervisor, Bill Gibson**

Over the last few years the number of outstanding nominations has declined.

Patrols should start now to complete next year's submissions.

A proposal will be discussed at the FWD Winter Board meeting to limit the number of times a person can be nominated in a 4 year period.

Star nominations can be submitted at any time. Purple Star nominations require a letter from a medical authority with a wet signature.

Ron Cohen is the new resort president.

Reworking the shadow program for new patrollers.

Al Mortensen is a 50-year patroller.

Patrol is working on senior OEC training.

Alpine is working with Squaw on a benefits review.

### **Diamond Peak: Drew Oliphant**

Sam Padilla is the new paid Patrol Director, Dennis Griffith has retired.

There are 10 volunteers in the patrol. All are required to complete background checks.

The mountain may utilize non-NSP volunteers as patrollers this season.

### **Heavenly Patrol: Keith Neergaard**

Mountain opened 11/16 thru the Gondola, 1 run open.

Galaxy chair has been replaced with a fixed grip triple. The roller coaster is open.

New remote controlled snow making has been installed.

Patrol has moved from Google calendar to TEAM UP for on line signups.

Mountain SMR protocols are still evolving. Expect to use more scoops.

HAP now has 4 active patrollers with 50+ years of service but no candidates.

New resorts have been added to the Vail Epic pass issued to patrollers.

### **Homewood: Dave Stromswold, member proxy**

Susan Stover is the new Patrol Rep.

Expect to have 4 candidates/transfers.

New snowmaking controllers installed with a few bugs being worked out.

Hal Bechtel is now on the National Wall of Fame in the National office.

140 people attended a social gathering the night of their refresher.

2 members received National Appointments and 9 others various stars.

### **Kirkwood: Nancy Stromswold**

They have a new member who transferred from Northstar.

Ricky Newberry is now the Mtn Ops. Manager and Adam Eickmeir is the Paid PD.

Management may be receptive to developing a plan this season to allow volunteers next season. Initially only transfers would be accepted.

Dori Beitz (currently Dodge Ridge) will assume PR role next season. She will step down as MLR's Ass't RD but remain as their Womens' Advisor.

**Mt. Rose: Jane Patterson**

The mountain is now open.

A new family member has taken over management of the resort and plans to emphasise customer service.

**Northstar: Mike Fanelli****Sierra at Tahoe: Todd Sprague**

Patrol has 32 volunteers and about 24 paid staff.

Some volunteers attended the 4 day paid refresher.

Volunteer-paid integration is still being worked on.

MOM – “Moment of Magic” recognitions can be given by both paid & volunteer staff.

There may be some interest in the “modified” OEC certification if deadline extended.

Minimal snowmaking due to access to water.

Mtn. deciding if volunteers will be allowed to self-evac if needed.

Mtn. uses x-collars and has its own SMR flow chart.

**Squaw Valley: Tom Werner**

Currently have about 72 volunteers and a similar number of paid staff.

Thanks given for those who attended Tim O’Brien’s memorial.

A new 5-year development plan is under development.

Working to increase snowmaking from 300 acres.

Now have 2 full-time ALS members who can carry drugs for advanced care.

Resort will now enforce the helmet requirement for staff.

They have a new 4 page collision policy.

Average age of candidates is increasing. There is an increasing challenge to meet mountain requirements considering increasing age of applicants.

There is a new arbitration form for volunteers.

ALTARA is new ownership entity for Squaw/Alpine.

Currently 4 volunteer members, 4 paid, and 3 secondary.

May have 1-1/2 rookies.

Snowbird Chair has been moved to the side of the run. Looking to add snowmaking.

**Tahoe Donner Nordic: Jerry Milana**

Resort may open next weekend.

Now working with both Tahoe Fire & Care Flight for interface training.

Now using only Slisman traction splints per Care Flight request.

## Recap of 2017-18 Courses

**TBSP:** There were four successful ESR avalanche courses in 2017: 3 L1's and 1 L2. The three L1 courses will be repeated this season, as usual, but the L2 will not be offered (it is roughly on an every-other-year schedule).

## New Avalanche Curriculum Update

NSP's national avalanche program is in the process of updating the NSP curriculum to bring it in line with the American Avalanche Associations updated guidelines (which came out last season). With approval from A3, NSP course graduates will (in most cases) be able to count their NSP course as a prerequisite for further avalanche education that may fall outside the NSP system (e.g. AIARE Level 2 courses). The original plan was for this updated curriculum to be in place this season, but it looks like that will not happen. Instructors should continue to teach from the 2014 Avalanche Instructor's Manual (the latest edition) and expect changes to occur sometime between this spring and the 2019-20 season.

## Interest in Courses

Speaking from the TBSP course perspective, we have many interested public simply among the friends and family of instructors in addition to those from groups to which we advertise. We are discussing adding a second course this year pending instructor availability. If you have avalanche instructors (or trainees) that would like to do some additional teaching in a TBSP course, please get in touch with me.

## New Instructor Explosion!

Congratulations to Bob Moore (Squaw), Quinton Louie (Squaw), Tony Boggis (Squaw), David Stepner (Squaw), Marcus Dufort (Alpine), Nathan Smith (Heavenly), and Keith Neergaard (Heavenly)! All were officially approved as avalanche instructors within the last season. With several more instructor trainees in the pipeline, we're moving in the right direction to being able to handle the demand noted in the previous section. If your patrol has anyone interested in starting the instructor training program, let me know. I want to put together a 1-page document listing out the necessary steps, but have not yet had time. At the moment, the process starts with an email to me and/or Keith Church (Division Avy Supervisor).

## Continuing Education

Several continuing education events have occurred this fall:

1. The California Avalanche Workshop (CAW), an annual preseason gathering and series of presentations, occurred on Oct 20 in South Lake Tahoe
2. An ICE course was provided at the Tri-Advisory Nov 2-4, organized by Keith Church (and Rob Morrow?).

Avalanche instructors who attend one of these events should either (a) register for it on the NSP site if it is an NSP course (like the Tri-Advisory event), or (b) email Keith Church in order to get ICE credit.

## Proposals under consideration

I did not have time to propose a regional Avy program budget this year, but a couple of budget items have come to mind and will enter into a proposal as soon as I have some time:

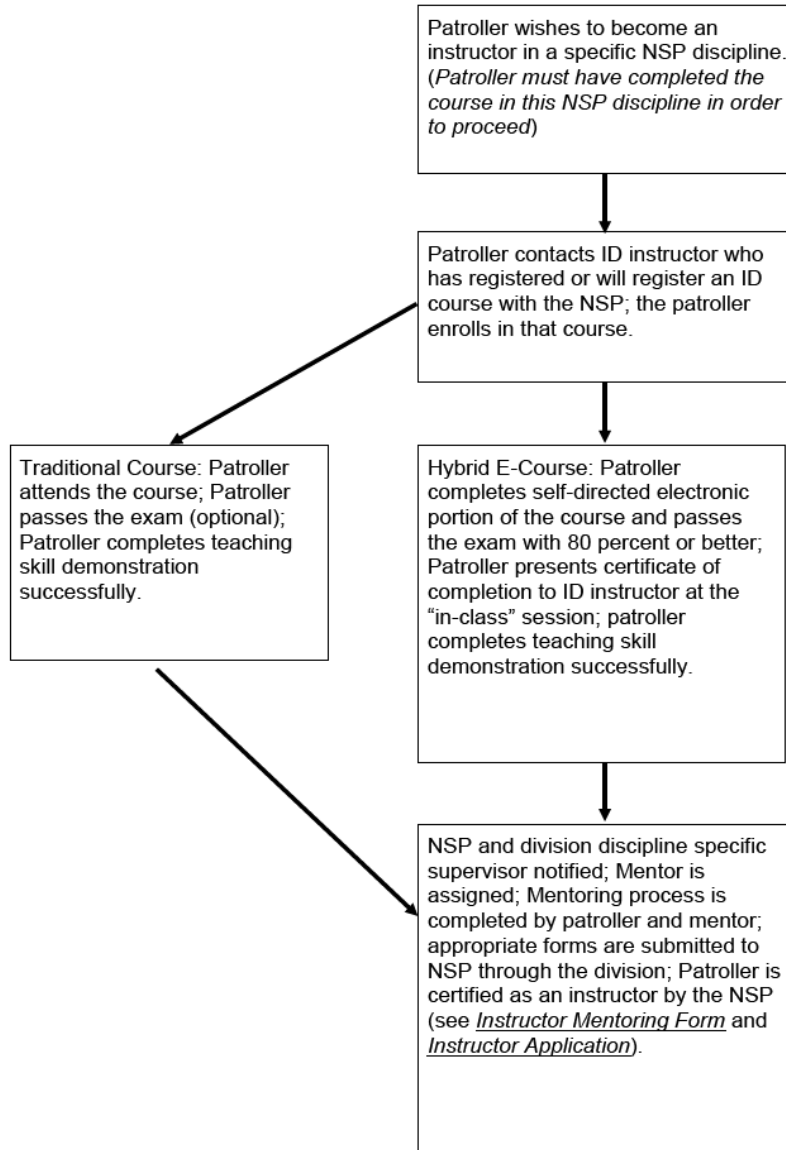
- 1) Investment in a portable beacon field, to be shared across ESR courses. [This](#) is the current BCA model under consideration and I have reached out to BCA about pricing for NSP. The current quote is \$4k. It is 8 beacons and probe targets + a controller that can turn each beacon on or off.
- 2) Supplementary support for instructors. Instructors put in a lot of time for the courses, both before (planning) and during the class. It would be nice to incentivize instruction by covering some portion of room/board/transport for instructors during their class. I think this could be supported by a combination of region funds and local patrol funds. This does not have to be an avy-specific program, but I do plan to propose this idea within at least the Avy program.

## **Instructor Development Sandy Sommer** November 2018

Since assuming the role as your ID administrator, one Instructor Development hybrid course has been offered at Tahoe, and another is in the planning stage for early season in the Bay Area. Courses can be customized to the needs of your patrol. Feel free to reach out if you have patrollers who are interested in becoming an instructor.

ACTION: Await responses from the above patrols and work with them to achieve an outstanding Alumni Day.

#### POTENTIAL ALUMNI HELP

During past ESR meetings, I handed out some ideas that active alums may want to provide to their patrols and areas. I would like to get more ideas from the Alumni to see how we can be of service to the Patrols, ESR, FWD and the National Program. We will get Tim's help also.

ACTION: PRs respond.

### **Medical Advisor Jim Margolis**

I reviewed two major OEC rescues and provided medical input for the ESR Awards chairman

I had several dialogues with the FWD and NSP Medical Advisors regarding OEC protocol and gave input about these locally:

Pelvic Binder--an important addition to OEC 5, but very vague. Conclusion: pelvic sling is indicated for ANY pelvic fracture, it is not for pain relief, but to control bleeding. If its use causes some discomfort, it should still be used. If the use of a binder causes severe worsening of pain, alternative should be considered; e.g., using the large Sager strap for support.

CAB vs ABC--unresponsive patient, if unknown etiology, begin with ABC; if witnessed MI, use AHA CAB.

Zol Chest Compressor-- this is mechanical device that will provide automatic chest compressions, it especially useful for providing CPR while transporting a patient in a toboggan. One of our patrols has purchased two of these devices. In dialogue with the NSP and Patrol Medical Advisors; it was recommended that this be used only in medical MIs, as the the regional EMS limits its use to this and that protocols for use be well documented for patrollers (training vs scope practice by patrols/resorts).

### **Recruitment and Retention Advisor Jim Margolis**

Snow Bomb: This continues to be our main organized R and R activity. Last year there was good attendance at our booth in Sacramento. This year we are having a booth again in San Francisco and Sacramento and both are well staffed. I continue to work closely with Matt Ridge, MLR R and R Advisor and John McGuigan FWD R and R Advisor.

I also found new homes for two patrollers who did not have a good fit at their first patrols. I updated our website on ESR.

We continue to look for other ways of recruiting; e.g. REI, fire fighters, etc.
